Hussy's Glow scores a game win at Morphetville!!!

Hussy's Glow is one of the most popular horses in our team. She never seems to run a bad race and is always having a crack. On Saturday she looked to be in a hopeless position on the turn at Morphetville but once Luke Currie got her into the clear she stormed home for a good win. She was a \$17,000 purchase from the 2015 Adelaide Magic Millions Sale. Adelaide has been a great hunting ground for us both at the sales and on the track.

Hussy's Glow took her earnings to \$143,910 from her five wins and seven placings. She was lucky enough to be stakes placed as a two year old which makes her a nice breeding proposition. She is by the highly regarded broodmare sire Hussonet. Hussy's Glow has been very well placed by Patrick Payne and now heads to Flemington for a heat of the Leilani Series on 23 June. She should get in on the limit and won't know herself after carrying big weights at her most recent start. She is another good horse I purchased from Cornerstone Stud. Other purchases from Cornerstone include Pitt Street, Our Netbank and The Hornet. The Hornet never reached great heights but did beat Tasmanian Champion Geegees Blackflash when she won her maiden.

Reneged ran very well at Randwick but the drying track and lack of speed hurt the horse's chances. He did a good job to make up many lengths in the straight but the winner had too easier a time in the lead. I was pleased with Tye Angland's comments after the race. Given the forecast of plenty of rain over the next couple of months around Sydney we should be able to place him to advantage.

I've never seen Black And Tan look better than she did at Flemington on Saturday but she ran well below her most recent runs and mucus showed up on a post-race scope. She was very unlucky not to win a nice race during this preparation and heads out for a well, deserved break. Her 4th placing in the Adelaide Guineas was heart breaking for all concerned. It was no one's fault but the way the race panned didn't give her the opportunity to get a crack at the leaders earlier enough.

Terry Bailey

Victorian Chief Steward Terry Bailey's announcement that he was resigning from his position to take up the role as Chief Steward in Singapore didn't come as a great surprise.

I have always found Terry to be very approachable and helpful in my dealings with him. No doubt there will be plenty written about his tenure as Chief Steward. Personally, I thought he did a great job. I'm sure he was more aware than most that some trainers were pushing the limits and doing the wrong thing and cheating on the honest participants in the industry.

His proactive approach saw all trainers put under notice that if they cheated they would be caught. I found it amusing to see the reaction by some of these trainers to this positive and aggressive approach. He put them out of their comfort zones and we have seen some of the worst offenders banned from our industry which is a good thing.

I wish him well in his new role with racing in Singapore being the winner and racing in Victoria left to find a suitable replacement. We seem to have a shortage of experienced stewards in Australia at present.

On The Track

We have plenty happening during the next few days. Today we have Chalmers running at Warwick Farm, Casa De Lago at Sandown and Addocarr in the Toowoomba meeting that has been transferred from Doomben.

The weather will dictate where our other runners go later in the week and I will send out a report on our runners closer to the weekend. Heavy rain is forecast to fall across much of Victoria and South Australia later in the week with the temperatures dropping. We were the victim of this change at Swan Hill where I thought we had three good chances but we scratched all three when the track became a very heavy with the track itself as testing a surface as you would be likely to come across.

The track staff at Doomben deserve a special mention. They have been working under considerable pressure since Eagle Farm was closed and they have done a remarkable job to keep the track race worthy given the heavy work load it has had over the past couple of years.

Wallabies

Congratulations to the Wallabies after their strong win over Ireland. This was the win the ARU needed more than anything to start to rebuild confidence in the sport in Australia. Ireland are a very good side and ranked 2nd in World Rugby.

I'm looking forward to attending the Second Test in Melbourne on Saturday night and expect another great game. Good luck to both sides and I hope this game is every bit as good as the First Test which was a cracker.

Our Yearlings

Our yearlings are almost fully subscribed. I am tidying up the loose ends and will keep you updated on where we are at. I do have a couple of shares remaining in the Deep Field filly out of Cattalo going to John Thompson. I am pleased with our purchases this year and won't be attending the Magic Millions National Sale.

This filly has broken in exceptionally well with Dan Morton asking if I would leave it with him in Perth but I purchased her for our NSW operation and won't be changing direction with her.

John Thompson - Randwick

I have been inspecting the progeny of Deep Field at this year's sales but the ones I have liked were bringing more than I was prepared to spend. I found this filly at the Perth Magic Millions Sale and valued her at \$80,000. I managed to secure her for \$50,000 which was a bargain.

She is a very attractive filly. She is well grown and has a great hindquarter. She is also BOBS qualified which is a great advantage and as a result I will send her to John Thompson to train.

The progeny of Deep Field averaged \$219,231 at this year's Gold Coast Magic Millions Sale only behind I Am Invincible, Snitzel and Fastnet Rock on averages which gives you an idea of just how well his progeny were received.

I have had very good success buying out of the Perth Magic Millions. I have only purchased four yearlings with the three to race all being winners. Raido is the best of these and won the Listed Goldmarket Handicap at the Gold Coast recently breaking the race record. This followed on from his December win when he broke the Class record for 900m at the same track.

The other two winners I purchased were Invincible Me which has won five races and Maldicion who won just the one race but had good ability running in the Tasmanian Oaks. Unfortunately, she injured a tendon which finished her career. These three horses collectively cost \$150,000 to purchase and have won 13 races and \$385,233 with two still racing.

Deep Field

Deep Field was a very fast horse five races including two at Group 2 level, a Listed race and he was placed 3rd in the VRC Lightning Stakes. He has a superb pedigree being by the ill-fated Northern Meteor who looked like being a super star but died prematurely leaving three sire sons including Australia's Leading 2YO Sire this season in Zoustar as well as the highly credentialed Shooting To Win and Eurozone who looks like making a name for himself at stud.

Most good sires have a strong female line and that is certainly the case here with Deep Field being out of the very good race mare Listen Here. She is also the dam of the Caulfield Guineas winner, Shooting To Win.

Cattalo

Cattalo is by the Danehill line horse Tiger Hill who has been a great success as a broodmare sire. Most of his best results are overseas with his best performed runner here being Almandin, the 2016 Melbourne Cup winner.

This is only her third foal. The 2nd foal is a Sizzling colt trained by Lee Curtis who has a very good opinion of her.

The 2nd dam is by Marscay and was a 2yo Sydney winner. She has had six to race for five winners including the stakes placed Toquite which was also placed 4th in the AJC Randwick Guineas.

The 3rd dam is the Champion mare Mannerism the dam of the Moonee Valley Oaks and the Group 3 winner and sire Manner Hill.

I was thrilled to purchase this filly and look forward to her wearing our colours.
