AUSTRALIAN RACING

When you see some of the horrific things happening in other parts of the world we are very lucky to live in Australia and be able to participate in an industry we love.

For a country with Australia's population we have a thoroughbred industry that is in very good shape. Sure things are never going to be perfect and there could be better stakes in some of the states but overall we are travelling very nicely.

Look at these figures. In 2012/13 season \$553,500,109 in stakes was distributed back to the industry across Australia. A total of 748 stallions stood in Australia which is the smallest number in 20 years. In 1993/94 2,091 stallions stood but in those days many hobby farms stood their own horse. Today we have seen the stallions concentrated to a few farms particularly in NSW and Victoria.

In the next seven days 51 race meetings will be held in Australia with about 400 races being run. Most of these are TAB meetings with the popular Amateur Clubs still being very popular with these 'Picnics' getting good attendances. In the big scheme of things these meetings are very important as they help introduce many people to racing.

Next week I will give you an idea how the \$553,500,109 is funded.

The Scone Cup meeting was a great success and has really backs the decision of Racing NSW to give the rich country club a stand-alone Saturday meeting. Magic Albert / Molly Rocks filly

This is as good a type of filly as I have ever purchased. She reminds me a lot a good mare Bill Mitchell trained named Flickering Fire.

She is a truly magnificent athlete to look at and this athleticism is backed up with a wonderful pedigree.

I can't wait for her to race. She heads to Kris Lees who has done a marvelous job for us training the very good horses Under Command, Hidden Wonder, Sweet Talkin Woman, Pitt Street and Namsarai. Recently Kris stepped out a three year old named Unique who created a big impression winning a maiden at Newcastle. He looks a star in the making.

Magic Albert has established himself as a sire of tough competitive horses with 30 stakes horses amongst his 332 winners. Included are the Group 1 winners Albert The Fat, Ilovethiscity, Magic Cape and Fighting Warrior.

Magic Albert is a son of the great Zeditave and this sire line has produced the most winners for Prime Thoroughbreds with horses such as Calming, Too Many Reds, Greenmount Belle, Zelady, I Am Magic and Hotel Casino purchased by me.

Molly Rocks is a daughter of one of Danehill's best sons in Rock Of Gibraltar. She won three races and this is

only her second foal. She is out of the very good two year old Speedy Bell and a sister to the multiple stakes winner Speedy Natalie.

This is a great female line with the first three dams producing 12 winners from just 14 to race. This includes 5 stakes winners.

Finally, I am thrilled to have secured such a well-priced filly and look forward to her racing. The filly will be syndicated into 10 shares @ \$9,000 each. Half shares available @ \$4,500 each.
