When Cautious Lover, our first winner won at Gosford on 2 February 1999 I must say I wasn't sure where we were headed but it has been a great journey where we have met some terrific people. Princess Royale was also good resuming after a long break but had a torrid run and to her credit fought on to hold second place.

It makes a big difference when things go right in the run. We have had half a dozen runners recently that should have won but we didn't get the breaks we needed in the run.

It felt a bit awkward not having any runners on the weekend but with the Inglis Open Day on it gave us time to properly prepare for the day.

The weather will play a big part in how many runners we have in the next week. At this stage Mosse Diva is down to run at Randwick tomorrow although this is dependent on track conditions. On Saturday Awasita is set to run at Moonee Valley and Hijack Hussy is likely to have her final run for the preparation at Doomben. 50ml of rain fell overnight at Eagle Farm. Pitt Street is being nominated for Warwick Farm and Tarting Me Up at Doomben for next Wednesday. Mossiel Village is set to run in Launceston on Wednesday as well.

## INGLIS OPEN DAYS

The Inglis Open Days at Randwick and Oaklands Junction provided a great opportunity for us to highlight our company against the opposition. I always enjoy meeting new people who are interested in our industry and I was surprised just how many follow Prime Thoroughbreds horses.

One of the big eye openers for me was comparing the mark up on the yearlings on offer from different syndication companies. In my opinion some of the mark ups are ridiculous.

Compare these:

Dream Thoroughbreds - Time Thief/Melisande filly purchase price **\$66,000** incl GST -  
Selling Price \$121,000 (**Mark up \$55,000**)

Dynamic Syndications – Reward For Effort/Walklikeanegyptian filly purchase price **\$44,000** incl GST - Selling price \$102,000 (**Mark up \$58,000!!!**)

Dynamic Syndications – Reward For Effort/Fairy Rainbeam filly purchase price **\$27,500** incl GST - Selling Price \$82,000 (**Mark up \$54,500!!!**)

Round Table Racing – More Than Ready/Cinque Centro colt purchase price **\$176,000** incl GST - Selling Price \$235,340 (**Mark up \$59,340**)

Spicer Thoroughbreds – Starcraft/Chordata filly purchase price **\$55,000** incl GST - Selling price \$110,000 (**Mark up \$55,000**)

I can't get my head around some of the figures outlined above and they were taken directly from the catalogue provided by the Inglis Company for the day so I can only assume they are correct. Always remember the investors in these syndications are paying for the expensive advertisements seen on Sky Channel and TVN.

**Always check the figures in the Product Disclosure Statements (PDS) which should outline in detail the costs involved in bringing the partnerships together and any other financial costs to you down the track. Our PDS are approved by Racing Victoria before we send them out to prospective buyers.**

The requirement for Thoroughbred Syndicators to be licenced was originally introduced by the industry to protect the public and for investors to be given the correct information of where the horse was purchased and for what price. It is a great service. Prior to the Licence being introduced we saw the situation where well bred horses with issues were being purchased cheaply and syndicated for amazing mark ups. I won't syndicate a horse without an approved PDS being in place.

You should always ask for the PDS before making a decision and if the Syndicator or Authorized representative is hesitant to forward one out ask yourself WHY NOT?

### **STATISTICS**

I strongly recommend you check the statistics at the Bloodstock.com.au site **which independently monitors** the results of syndicators who provide their stable of horses to bloodstock.com.au. This is a great service and if your syndicator isn't being monitored you should ask yourself 'WHY'.

### **YEARLING OF THE WEEK**

#### **Not A Single Doubt filly from Our Greta**

#### **Patrick Payne to train**



Pictured above is a stunning filly by Not A Single Doubt out of the good producing Rory's Jester mare Our Greta. The filly looks like a running two year old to me and will be aimed at the early two year old races. I am paying her up for the Adelaide Magic Millions and she will be nominated for the Blue Diamond Stakes.

#### **Not A Single Doubt**

Not A Single Doubt has been a terrific sire of precocious two year olds with the outstanding two year old fillies Miracles Of Life, Villa Verde and Karuta Queen being by this outstanding horse. Not A Single doubt is currently 5th on the national two year old list.

#### **Our Greta**

Our Greta is by the Champion Sire Rory's Jester. Rory's Jester has been consistently been amongst the very best broodmare sires in Australia for many years. When Rory's Jester mares have been crossed with Danehill line stallions the results have been exceptional with the Group 1 winners Reward For Effort and Southern Lord being produced as well as the Group and Listed winners Vintedge, Permaisucous, Rosa's Spur, Hinting, World Peace and Downhill Racer.

Our Greta has had two to race with both winning including the very good gelding Victorious with 3 wins and \$203,000 in stakes money. He recently ran 3rd in Hong Kong. This is her 4th foal. The 3rd foal is a two year old filly by Choisir and is reported to have nice ability.

This filly is bred on a similar cross to Villa Verde.

### **The Filly**

This is a great filly. She has an excellent pedigree and is a really good type of a horse. She has a wonderful attitude and gets around very well. She has a lovely easy, relaxed walk.

The filly was grown out at Mill Park Stud in South Australia after being weaned at Edinglassie Stud in the Hunter Valley where Mick Talty said she was a strong foal with a great temperament and terrific doer.

Not only does she offer her owners the opportunity to race a top class filly but also she has the potential to be a very valuable brood mare should she win a nice race.

I am more than pleased to have secured her and she will head to Patrick Payne to be trained. 10 shares @ \$9,000 each (1/2 shares @ \$4,500 each) **Only 6.5 shares remain.**
